

FLETCHER HOTEL

4196 PETROLIA LINE

**Year Current Building
Erected: 1893**

This location was originally the Livery Stable, a store that rented horses and carriages back in the 1880s. The Fletcher Hotel was established in 1885 and the brick building was constructed in 1893. An addition was added in 1912 and the 40 hotel rooms located on the second level were removed to make room for Stirret's shoe & clothing store.

Occupants have included Herb Slack's barbershop, Doman & Hyatt's motor sales & machine shop as well as Stirrett's shoes & clothing. However it has mostly served as an inn and/or tavern that has changed names many times. Among them, the Fletcher Hotel, the Hotel Hillman, the Hard Oil Inn, the Kimberly Tavern.
